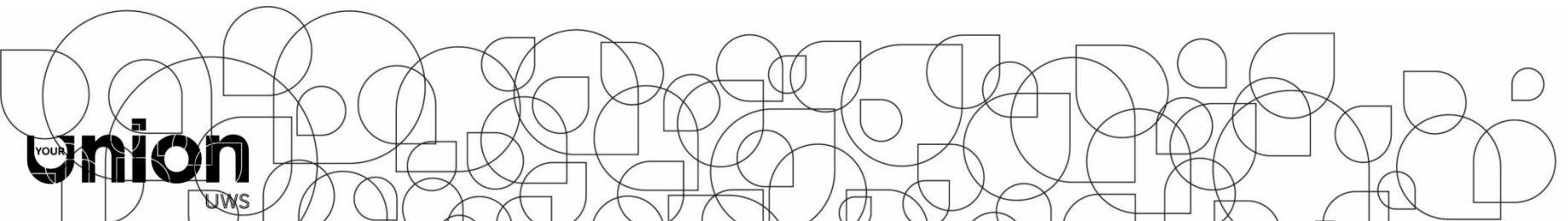




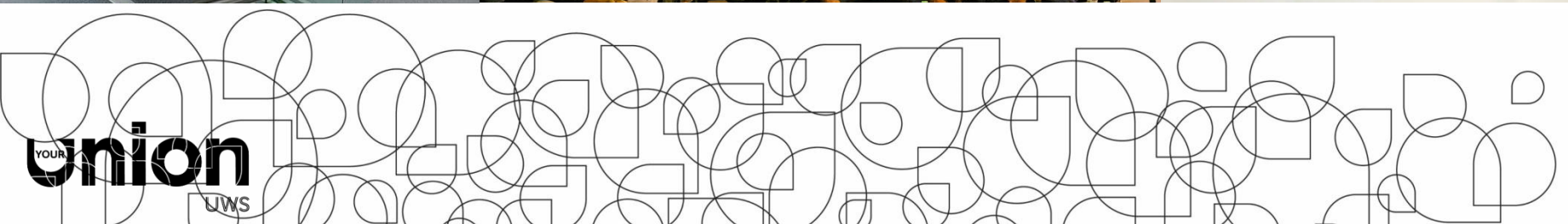

## Student Led

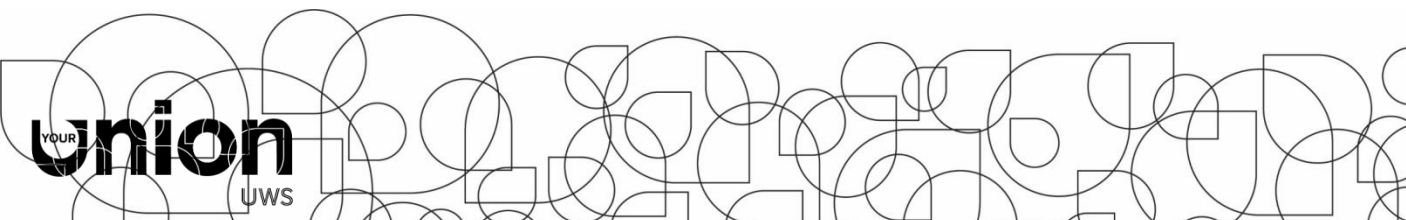
We are led by students for students and ensure that student voices are at the heart of everything we do

# What are Societies?

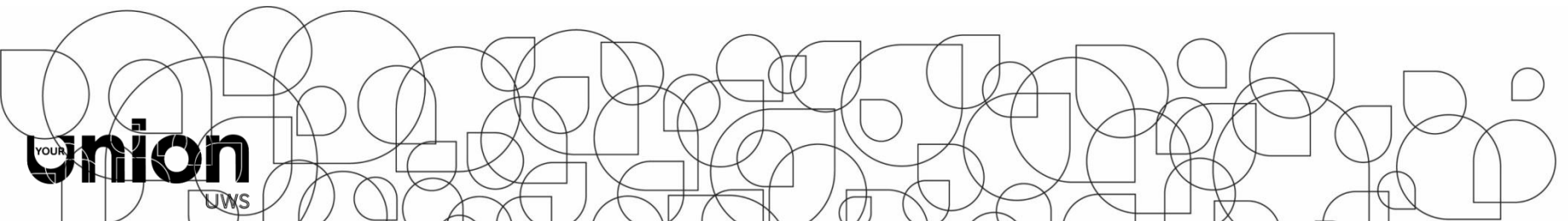
Student-led groups, formed and run by students, which bring together people who have a shared interest or identity

- Create social opportunities and communities for students
- Enjoy shared interests together
- Support each other through university and help you make the most of your experience



# What you receive from the Students' Union

- A page for your society on our website
  - This can be used to advertise your society, collect memberships and sell tickets
- A society Gmail account
  - This gives you a contact email without having to share your personal details
  - This is used to contact your society members
  - The Students' Union will contact you through this account
  - Log in details can be shared between committee members to help share the workload
- A bank account with the Students' Union
  - This means no-one needs to be individually responsible for any money your society has
  - It also enables the Students' Union to provide funding support
- Funding support
- Free bookings for Students' Union and university spaces
- Help with promoting your society and activities



# Affiliating your society with the Students' Union

## What does affiliation mean?

- Completing the steps below to have your society officially part of the Students' Union
- Your society needs to be affiliated to access support for bookings, promotion, finances and funding

## What do you need to do to affiliate your society?

1. All committee members attend a society training session
2. Complete your Society Action Plan
  - Confirm who's on your society committee
  - Identify your main aims and activities for the year
3. Complete Data Protection Training
  - Everyone who have admin rights for your society page or log in details for your email account must complete this
4. Attend Societies Council
  - At least one member of your society must attend our Societies council meetings
5. Host your first meeting or activity



# Using your Society webpage

## How do you get admin rights for your society webpage?

- Once you send your completed Action Plan, admin rights will be given to the students you have indicated need access to this
- They all need to join your society through the webpage first

## How do you access you admin pages?

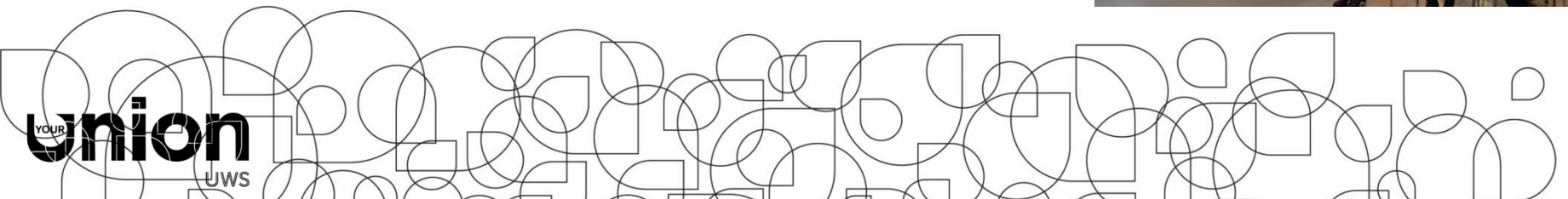
- Log in with your student ID and password, select the **cog symbol** in the top right corner to access the admin pages for the societies
- In the **edit details** tab, you can update the information that appears on the society page
- The **members** and **messages** tabs let you see your membership list and send them emails

# Getting your society up and running

## Organising your first event/activity:

1. Agree the aim of your event
2. Agree how you will work together to achieve this
3. Book a space
4. Invite members:
  - Emails, group chats, social media
  - You're welcome to use whatever apps or platforms suit you best for communicating
5. Promote to other students:
  - Posters and flyers: send designs to [societies@uwsunion.org.uk](mailto:societies@uwsunion.org.uk)
  - Advertise on Students' Union website
  - Ask academic staff to promote
  - Book a stall on campus to speak to students directly
6. Any finance and funding required?
7. Risk assessment required?



# Societies Agreement

## What you can expect from the Students' Union officers and staff:

- We won't organise your events and activities for you but will provide guidance to support you
- We'll listen to any ideas you have and try our best to help you achieve them
- We'll provide a platform for you to promote your society and activities to other students
- We'll help book spaces for you to host your events and activities
- We'll support you with managing finances for your society
- We'll respond to society requests within three working days (Monday-Friday)
- We'll keep you up to date on additional support available from the Students' Union and the university

## What the Students' Union officers and staff can expect from you:

- You'll take the lead on organising your events and activities
- You'll keep the Students' Union up to date on your plans and any changes
- You'll listen to advice and guidance given by the Students' Union
- You'll ask for help when you need it
- You'll ensure your events and activities are inclusive and accessible to all UWS students
- You'll have some sort of handover ready, for new leadership to take over your society once you graduate
- You'll enjoy your society role and benefit from it!

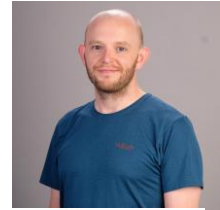

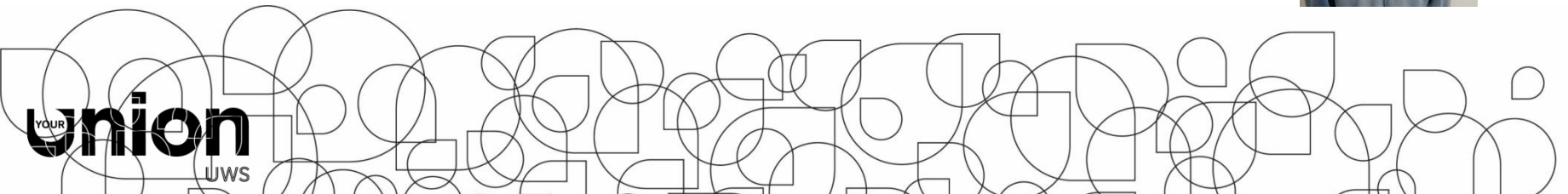

# International Students' Volunteering

## Voluntary work restrictions?

At the Students' Union, we are aware, that there may be some fears from our international students on taking on a volunteering role with us, due to the constraints Home Office place on Student Visas. Rest assured society leadership (and our student rep roles) is not considered voluntary work by government guidelines as it does not:

- Require students to enter a contract with the Students' Union
- Carry out work for the Students' Union that needs you carry out tasks, and attend spaces at specific times
- Receive a salary of any kind
- Replace a paid role
